


Unveiling of Clinical Handbook



Background and Objectives: Blood centers around the globe are dependent on voluntary blood donation from healthy individuals to meet their blood supplies. The severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus-2 pandemic has become one of the most critical global health emergencies of modern times. Blood transfusion service (BTS) in India faced numerous challenges during the COVID-19 outbreak and the following imposed country lockdown. We aim to identify the challenges faced by a standalone blood center and explore the multigation strategies implemented during the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent lockdown. Methods: A cross-sectional study conducted at a standalone blood center done over a time period of 05 months including the nationwide lockdown phase. Personal invitation of donors, social media awareness, and in-house donation drives were implemented to improve donor inflow. Restricted donor entry, stringent donor selection, and adequate samitization strategies were the key steps adopted to ensure the safety of donors and staffs. Results: After a declaration of nationwide lockdown in India, blood donation showed a drop of 13.36% and blood demand was also reduced by 25.70% in our study. Conclusions: The COVID-19 pandemic affected blood donation process and blood supply and adversely affected BTSs. Scholl always be vigilant to adopt new practices even before guidelines are set by regulatory authorities in adverse situations. Restrictive blood transfusion strategies need to be emphasized in the country.

Important is to develop a blood order set.

Two ordering pathways. One, for the Two ordering pathways. One, for the hemodynamically stable patient who's anemic and the hemodynamically unstable patient, because those are two very different clinical situations. Massive transfusions or obstetrical hemorrhages and so forth, when red is coming out, put red back in. We got to have some yellow in there, to add some platelets or plasma or CRYO. It would prevent over this order of the plate o utilisation of red cells and underutilisation of the plasma based products.

Clinical situation based order sets

How many units do you want? What special needs do you require? What's the reason? If it's significant active bleeding? Is the hemoglobin <7 or is the hemoglobin <8?

The right amount, not anymore but not any less than a patient might need.

Critical values are really important. Critical value down to, first we got it to 7 and

eventually we got it to 6.5 gm/dl was really, really important. It requires immediate intervention and if something doesn't happen within an hour, that there nappen within an hour, that there will be significant morbidity or mortality, 6.5 is not a hemoglobin one would consider particularly life threatening for a patient with anemia. On the other hand, a hemoglobin of 10, if the last haemoglobin for a patient was 10 but they have three buckets of blood on the floor, that may not at all temperate what's enjar on with may not at all represent what's going on with that patient clinically. So, the critical value is one piece of information, but it's only ONE piece of information. It can be very important but it always has to be taken into clinical

you check a hemoglobin in between and or if it's a platelet dose, could you check a platelet count in between your two unit or three unit order? One at a time v/s two at a time

We could retest the haemoglobin in between units within about 15 min of completing first blood transfusion, provided the patient is not actively bleeding or consuming product internally.

We should also take into account the identification of preoperative, pre-elective surgery anemia in a population, an older population that is probably prone to iron deficiency anemia or anemia of chronic

The philosophy of patient blood managemen is "THE RIGHT PRODUCT, AT THE RIGHT DOSE, AT THE RIGHT TIME". This really is about patient safety. That's the whole goal; to get better outcomes for our patients.






